Lizzie Kimbley is a UK based textile artist and handweaver. She works with woven textiles, natural dyes and basketry techniques to create contemporary artworks exploring walking and connection to place and nature. Lizzie enjoys the parallels between walking and weaving; for her the slowness and movement of walking are echoed in the repetition and rhythms of the weaving process making each a mindful and meditative practice. Conscious of the volume of waste sent to landfill each year, and the need to value our natural resources, Lizzie has a material-led approach often using natural found materials or those leftover from other design processes. Lizzie is a part-time Lecturer on the BA Textile Design course at Norwich University of the Arts.
